Raising our public profile

2006 saw the Branch raise its public profile in the community by having a presence with Lambeth TUC, GLATUC and TUC at Clapham Pride, RISE, Lambeth Country Show and Soho Pride.

We also sent delegates to the Palestine Solidarity Campaign Trade Union Conference, Latin America 2006 and the AGM of the United Campaign for the Repeal of Anti-Trade Union Laws

Our banner was on the London May Day march organised by the TUC. This was the largest event to date in support of the Trade Union Freedom Bill.

Seamus MacBride for his work on the site and keeping it updated.

We have been able to be active in the Region I ACTS Trade Group Committee and the Region I Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual & Transgender Forum by having a delegate to both.

This has given the branch a voice at a Regional level, which we have not had before.

Double threat to jobs

The challenge for our members working in the voluntary sector in 2007 is the funding of organizations that employ our members – the cuts in ALG grants and Supporting People. Both funding streams are putting our members, jobs, pay and working conditions under threat.

It was agreed at the last Region I ACTS Trade Group to submit a motion to National ACTS Trade Group calling on the Union to campaign nationally on Supporting People.

The Branch is committed to supporting members in their workplaces. Members who are affected by cuts in ALG grants and in Supporting People are therefore, a priority for our branch.

The Branch has been very active in local Trade Union Councils, in particular Battersea & Wandsworth TUC, Croydon TUC and Lambeth TUC and through them the Greater London Association of Trade Union Councils – www.glatuc.org.uk


